Hello and welcome aboard Titanish!

Titanic was always one of my favorite movies growing up. On my 10th birthday, I had a sleepover with my friends and cousins and made them watch the entire movieyes BOTH VHS tapes! The drama, the love, the set, the score- Titanic has it all. There's a reason it won all of those Oscars! (Sorry Kate and Leo...)

Nostalgia is such a funny little beast. When I returned to Titanic as I was older, I was so surprised at what I saw. It was still that movie I knew and loved, following one of the greatest love stories I had ever seen, but it was also just so full of camp, ridiculous dialogue, over acting, and unintentional comedy. "I put the diamound in the coat....I put the coat on her!" What surprised me most however, was that it made me love it even more! This movie has it all and then some. It's camp, it's high drama, it's heartbreakingly beautiful, and it's just a little bit ridiculous. What more could you want?!

When approaching Titanish, I wanted this production to turn Titanic on its head a little but also still approach it with love and care. We were incredibly serious about being incredibly silly, and the love of the movie was always a driving force in our choices.

I want to make theatre centered around joy but joy has nuances. Love, music, laughter, heartache, and hope are all part of those. Titanic the movie was about the joy of love, and I hope tonight we are able to fill you full of joy (even if our ratio of laughter versus love is just a little bit different than the movie).

I could go on and on (hah! Get it?) about how much I have enjoyed this collaborative process but I think it is simply best to say to them all: "It's been a privilege playing with you tonight."
